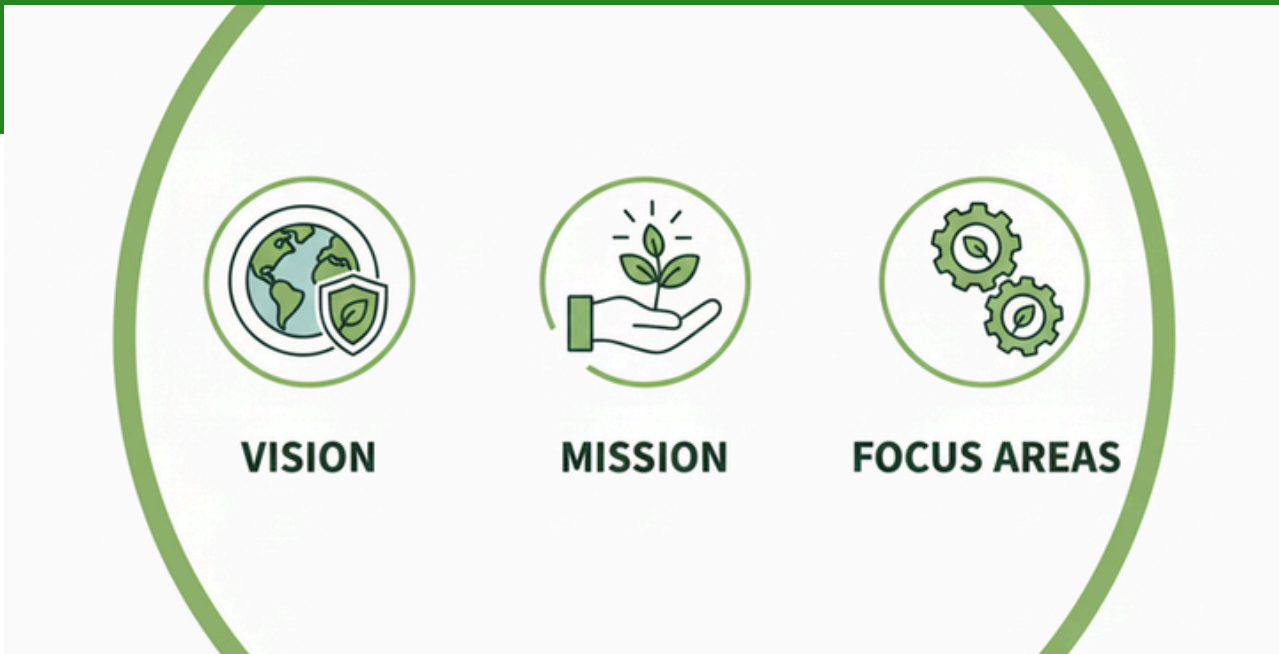

FXB CLIMATE ADVOCATE FELLOWSHIP PROJECT

Empowering Youth and Local Communities for Climate & Biodiversity Action

As part of the FXB Climate Advocate Fellowship, Climate Warden implemented a school-based climate education project focused on youth engagement and biodiversity protection.

The project included:

- Climate and biodiversity education sessions
- Establishment of school Eco Clubs

- Tree planting within school premises
- Youth-led environmental stewardship

Schools reached:

- Crescent Comprehensive School
- Success Friends International Academy.

Students gained foundational climate knowledge while actively participating in environmental action, translating learning into practice.

YDOS CAMPAIGN PROJECT (ONGOING)

Green School, Green Future: Youth-Led Eco Action in Bauchi State

Climate Warden launched under YDoS Campaign project to deepen climate education and promote youth-led environmental action in schools.

Key activities include:

- Eco Club establishment and strengthening
- Introduction to technology and AI for climate action

- Tree planting and school greening

Schools reached:

- Federal Low-Cost Primary School
- Bakari Dukku Primary School

The project is ongoing, fostering sustained youth leadership and climate-smart behaviors.



INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR

From COP30 to Communities: Connecting Global Climate Action to Local Realities

Climate Warden organized an international webinar bringing together speakers and participants from around the world.

The webinar focused on:
